Risk and Protective Factors for Suicide among Sexual Minority Youth (R01MH091212-01A1): New York University. This five-year NIH-funded longitudinal research study is designed to follow a diverse sample of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) youth, ages 15-24, and to examine changes in constellations, magnitudes, and developmental sequences of risk and protective factors for suicidal behaviors with a particular emphasis on the major components of the interpersonal psychological theory of suicide.
